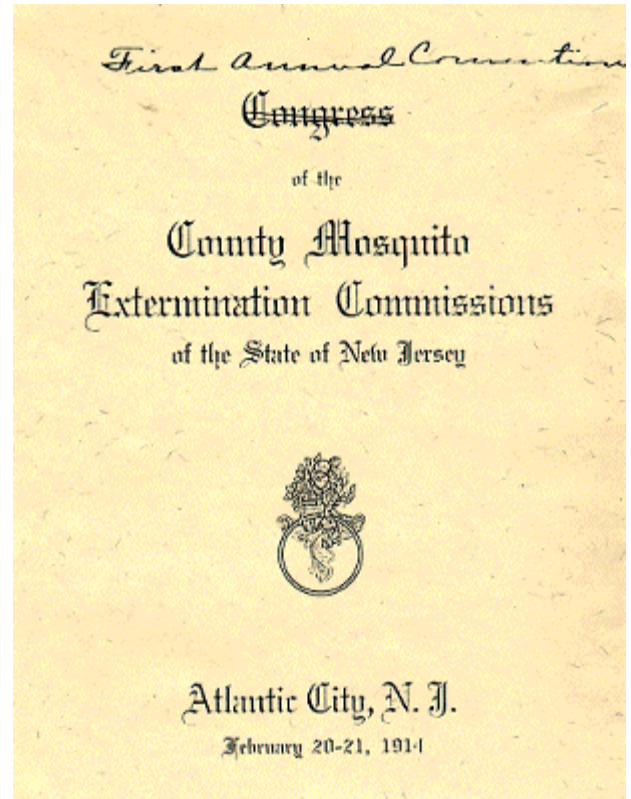


First Annual Convention of New Jersey County Mosquito Extermination Commission
